

Tree and Shrub Planting Guideline

The following includes the hardiest selections for the conditions primarily found in this area. This list is intended only as a guideline. There are many other species that could be successful in various micro-climates on the **Gallatin River Ranch**.

Codes behind the plant name indicate that a plant is not only generally hardy for this area but is particularly tolerant of specific conditions. These plants would be suitable for other sites too.
